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Adult Redeploy Illinois (ARI) Training, Technical Assistance and Development (TTAD) NOFO # 2115-1023

RESPONSE TO APPLICANT QUESTIONS

Day posted: December 8, 2023

Question

Is it correct to assume that during the four-month project period (March-June 2024), there is an expectation that individualized technical assistance to the ARI grantees would be limited, and the focus of the work should center on planning and developing the TTAD program? (The solicitation notes that one TTA deliverable is expected per quarter, but the length of the project period is only one quarter.)

Response

You are correct that the initial four months of this funding opportunity (March-June 2024) will largely be devoted to planning and developing the TTAD program. We do anticipate there will be opportunities to engage with grantee sites around training, technical assistance, and development during the grant period, including with a planned All-Sites Summit tentatively planned for May 2024.

Question

On the grant application, section 6 of 7 is Titled Goals and Performance Metrics. The instructions ask that I download a form. However, when I attempt to download the form, nothing is in the download. I tried a few times, and then gave up. I would like to complete this step to submit the application. May you pls check to see if the application is glitching. Also am I allowed to upload a narrative of my goals and performance metrics?

Response

As indicated in the <u>Notice of Funding Opportunity instructions</u> in the Program Narrative section at the end (excerpted below), you should download the Performance Metrics Chart in AmpliFund; fill it out with your proposed objectives on the left-hand side of the chart, using the suggested types of metrics on the right-hand side of the chart; and then upload the chart in AmpliFund.

We have not found any malfunction in AmpliFund. The item is the Performance Metric download, all downloads were double checked. This may be a user issue with your browser. You may not "see" where the item is being downloaded, or have downloads blocked. You should work with IT regarding downloads.

Question

May you please explain the type of technical assistance the ARI is seeking?

Response

ARI anticipates that in addition to training opportunities, grantee sites will seek and benefit from ongoing, flexible, and tailored technical assistance and support that may include assessing program needs; providing consultation on program development and implementation, including technical assistance to ensure fidelity to evidence-based program models; developing capacities within organizations and programming/services such those that are equitable, trauma-informed, strengths-based, and rooted in restorative justice principles; and conducting on-site and virtual follow-up visits and developing performance improvement plans where necessary.

Question

What does ARI mean when they express their interest in evidence based practices?

Response

According to ARI's enabling legislation, the <u>Crime Reduction Act</u>, " 'evidence-based practices' means policies, procedures, programs, and practices that have been demonstrated to reduce recidivism among incarcerated individuals and individuals on local supervision." Examples of <u>evidence-based practices</u> used by ARI sites are described on the <u>ARI website</u> at the Approach tab.

Question

Does the Grant require me to provide a detailed explanation of the comprehensive, effective training, and responsive programs and services that we offer?

Response

Applicants are required to answer the Program Narrative questions in the <u>AmpliFund</u> grant management system to describe how they will create and implement a training, technical assistance, and development program to meet the needs of ARI grantee sites operating local prison diversion programs around the state, to increase sites' effectiveness in providing client

supervision and services and advancing ARI's mission, vision, and values. Applicants are encouraged to answer the questions as concisely and comprehensively as possible while keeping the scoring criteria in mind.

Question

The budget instructions indicate that "most food and beverages" are ineligible expenses. Is it possible to request a portion of funding to provide food and water to attendees at TTAD and training events?

Response

Generally ICJIA grant funds cannot be used to pay for food and beverages, with some exceptions related to children's after school programs and community meetings. It is suggested that applicants include the reasonable and necessary food and beverage costs they think are integral to the proposed TTAD program; and, if selected, further negotiations and determinations regarding allowability will take place during the grant execution process.

Question

Of the 27 current ARI sites, how many are focused on probation (as opposed to courts)? Is it possible to identify which sites these are by name?

Response

According to the <u>Crime Reduction Act</u>, ARI's enabling legislation: "The Adult Redeploy Illinois program shall reallocate State funds to local jurisdictions that successfully establish a process to assess offenders and provide a continuum of locally based sanctions and treatment alternatives for offenders who would be incarcerated in a State facility if those local services and sanctions did not exist." There is flexibility as to how ARI funding can be utilized, which is determined by local jurisdictions according to their unique needs and resources. Currently, ARI has 27 grantee sites covering 45 counties and operating more than 50 prison diversion programs. Approximately two-thirds of the diversion programs are treatment courts (drug courts, mental health courts, veterans courts) and the other one-third are specialized probation caseloads with services. Question

For the ARI TTAD funding opportunity, is there only a character limit for the Summary portion?

Response

Yes, there is only a character limit (5,000 characters maximum) established for the Summary portion. This is to ensure that we have brief, stand-alone descriptions of the overall proposals readily available for internal and external review.

Question

Are applicants permitted to use as many characters as needed in the remaining response sections?

Response

Yes, however we encourage applicants to be as concise and comprehensive as possible with their responses while keeping the scoring criteria in mind.

Question

Who has provided these services in the past?

Response

This is the first-ever training, technical assistance, and development (TTAD) program that Adult Redeploy Illinois (ARI) has been able to establish. We anticipate the development of the TTAD program will be a collaborative process among the funded provider(s), and ARI staff, sites, and the Oversight Board.

Question

Are the ARI sites 100% problem solving courts within Illinois (are they drug courts, mental health courts, domestic violence courts, veterans courts, etc.)?

Response

According to the <u>Crime Reduction Act</u>, ARI's enabling legislation: "The Adult Redeploy Illinois program shall reallocate State funds to local jurisdictions that successfully establish a process to assess offenders and provide a continuum of locally based sanctions and treatment alternatives for offenders who would be incarcerated in a State facility if those local services and sanctions did not exist." There is flexibility as to how ARI funding can be utilized, which is determined by local jurisdictions according to their unique needs and resources. Currently, ARI has 27 grantee sites covering 45 counties and operating more than 50 prison diversion programs.
