

Online Map of Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority Grants

This mapping application displays information about Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA) grant programs. ICJIA implements and funds criminal justice and violence prevention programs under the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA), Victims of Crime Act (VOCA), Adult Redeploy Illinois (ARI), Restore, Reinvest, Renew (R3) Program, and other state and federal grant programs. Some funding sources award grants to many different organizations to offer similar types of services through a competitive process, like the R3 program. Other funding sources award grants to a single organization to provide specific programming, like a grant to the Acclivus organization to deliver hospital and community-based violence prevention services to reduce community violence. Users can employ this tool to examine locations where grants from various funding sources are awarded and what grants are active in their communities. Each data point contains information about the total amount of funding awarded to an organization under the grant program.

The data presented in the mapping application include grants that are currently active. These data will be updated quarterly to capture newly awarded grants and remove grants that are closed. The map is searchable by location or by organization name. Users can filter the map to see grants of select funding sources or all grants within a select county or state legislative district. Details on these functionalities are provided below.

Map Functionality

Layers List

The layers list allows the user to select different layers to view on the map. Users can choose to display the outlines of Illinois counties (default) or Illinois state legislative districts (Senate or House). Additionally, the layers list contains the legend for the point layer of all open grants defining which indicators of different shapes and colors correlate to each funding source. To use this functionality:


• Open or close the layers list with this icon. (The layers list will be open by default.)



Toggle individual layers on/off with the checkboxes.




 View the legend information for each layer by clicking the arrow to the left of the checkbox.



• Search among the layers by keyword using the magnifying glass at the top right of the layer list box.



• Turn all layers on/off or expand/collapse all layers' legend information at once using the checkmark button in the top right corner of the layer list.



Filter

The filter tool allows the user to limit the points displayed on the map to those of a select funding source. Alternatively, the user can filter by geography (county or state legislative district) to view only the grants located in a select area. To use this functionality:


• Select the filter function using this icon.



• Choose to filter by funding source, county, state senate district, or state house district.



• Select a funding opportunity, county, or state legislative district from the drop-down list or type in the name and press the "Apply" button.



 Return to displaying points from all funding sources or geographies with the "Reset" button.

Attribute Table

The attribute table feature provides a tabular view of data associated with the open grants layer. These data can be exported to a CSV format for printing or additional analyses. To use this functionality:

• Select the attribute table function using this icon.



The attribute table will appear at the bottom of the map window like the example below.



The table options menu allows the user to filter the table, show or hide columns in the table, and export the table to CSV.



- The "Filter by map extent" button limits the records displayed in the table to the points visible in the map's current view. Click to toggle this feature on and off.
 - For example, if the user has filtered to only display R3 grants in the map, then the table will only show R3 grant records. Alternatively, if the user has zoomed in to a specific area, only the grant records in that zoomed in view will be display in the table.

Filter by map extent

• The "Zoom to" button will pan the map's view to zoom in on any features selected in the table.



- o The "Clear selection" button will deselect any records highlighted in the table.

- The "Refresh" button will update the table's records to reflect the current map view's extent, filters, and selections.



Search

Searching in the box above the Layer List and Filter icons lets users zoom directly to a point of interest on the map, with an automatic pop-up window appearing giving details on the chosen point. The map tool provides suggestions to complete a search term and displays options that users may choose to go to on the map. To use this functionality:

• Type an address or place in the search bar and press enter or click the magnifying glass at the right of the search bar.



- Search geographies by street address, city, zip code, county, legislative district, or search for a funded program by organization name.
 - o To search only among features of a single layer, use the drop-down arrow at the left of the search bar to select the desired layer.



• Use the +/- buttons in the top left corner of the map to zoom in and out. Use the home button to return to a statewide view.




• Use the forward and back arrow buttons at the left side of the map to navigate the view to the previous or next extent (level of zoom).




Point & Click Selection and Pop-ups

Clicking geographies and points on the map brings up a pop-up with detailed information related to the location(s). For the open grants layer, this information includes the funding source, the name of the grantee organization, and the total funding amount awarded. For the geography layers, the pop-up will include the name of the county or state legislative district. To use this functionality:

- Click anywhere within the state of Illinois.
 - o Only layers from the layer list that are toggled on will display pop-up information.
- If the point clicked encompasses multiple points or geographies (from distinct layers or when zoomed out to a wide extent relative to small geographies), the number of selected items will be displayed as "(1 of n)" in the pop-up heading.
 - o In the example below, clicking the point for New Directions of Jacksonville IL (part of the All Open Grants layer) will also bring up information about the same location in the other active layer (IL Counties).
 - The information for the selected item (highlighted in blue) is displayed in the tooltip.



To view tooltip information for the additional items encompassed within the point clicked, use the "Next feature" arrow in the top right corner of the tooltip.



The tooltip will then display available information about additional items at the point clicked (highlighted in blue).



Map Data Information

- Programs are mapped to the address listed by the grantee as their primary location.
 - o For some organizations, the address listed as their primary location corresponds to their headquarters, which may differ from the area in which they are funded to provide services.
 - As an example, a statewide service provider may list their primary location as the address of their main offices in northern Illinois but the grant funding was awarded to deliver services in southern Illinois.
- Data utilized to display all geographic outlines (i.e. counties and state legislative districts) come from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2023 <u>TIGER/line shapefiles</u>.
