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Background

The Illinois Freedom from Drone Surveillance Act establishes statewide reporting requirements for law enforcement agencies that own or operate drones. Under the Act [\[725 ILCS 167\]](#) (Appendix A), agencies must submit information on drone ownership, usage, and related policies to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA). ICJIA compiles these submissions and publishes an annual report covering drone activity statewide. The present report covers drone activity reported for Calendar Year (CY) 2025. Previous annual reports, dating back to State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2014, are available for download on ICJIA's [Drone Reporting for Law Enforcement Agencies webpage](#).

The Act states explicitly:

On July 1 of each year, the Authority [ICJIA] shall publish on its publicly available website a concise report that lists every law enforcement agency that owns a drone, and for each of those agencies, the number of drones that it owns, the number of times a drone was used pursuant to each paragraph of Section 15, including the date of use, time of use, reason for use, location, whether video was recorded, whether the video is designated for retention for training purposes. The report shall contain a copy of the agency's latest policy concerning drones as of the most recent April 1 [\[725 ILCS 167/35\(b\)\]](#).

The Act defines a "law enforcement agency" as "any agency or political subdivision of the state that is legally authorized to maintain public order and enforce criminal laws." A "drone" is defined as "any aerial vehicle that operates without a human operator on board."

Data Collection Process

Data Collection Tool

To support law enforcement agencies in submitting required information to ICJIA, an online data collection survey instrument was developed using Qualtrics software. The survey instrument was used to gather details on drone ownership and enabled agencies to upload their flight logs and drone policy documents directly into Qualtrics. Flight logs included the date of any drone flight, time of use, reason for use, location of the flight, whether the drone's video was recorded, and whether that video was saved for training purposes. Agencies that did not own any drones were still required to submit data via the survey instrument and indicate that they owned zero drones. Agencies were instructed to report on all drones owned or used during Calendar Year (CY) 2025 (spanning from January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025). This approach differed from previous years, in which agencies were asked to report data by state fiscal year (SFY), which spans from July 1 of a given year to June 30 of the following year.

Administration of the Data Collection Tool

We obtained the names and email addresses of law enforcement contacts listed in directories from the National Public Safety Information Bureau and the Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System (ILEAS). In February 2026, the survey instrument was emailed to 2,395 law enforcement contacts (e.g., Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, and other command staff) representing 1,058 agencies statewide. Table 1 shows the number of agencies contacted by agency type. A total of 586 agencies submitted responses to ICJIA, representing 55.4% of agencies contacted.

Following the initial email, agencies received seven follow-up emails before the April 1 submission deadline. This timeline ensured adequate time for ICJIA staff to complete data cleaning, analysis, and report preparation. Agencies that did not respond to data requests or that submitted incomplete responses were contacted by phone and/or email.

Data Analysis

The Act requires that ICJIA provide a list of every law enforcement agency that reported owning a drone, along with their flight logs containing details of drone usage. While the flight logs could be uploaded without further modification to fulfill the statutory requirement, ICJIA staff cleaned and analyzed the flight log data submitted by agencies to provide counts and show trends in reporting over time. The following steps were taken to compile and clean the dataset:

1. **Consolidation of flight logs** — Agencies submitted flight logs in Excel or CSV format. Each submission was merged into a master Excel table containing all reported flights.
2. **Standardization of formatting and data types** — Agencies reported information on flight time, duration, purpose, location, and data retention, but formats varied across submissions. Using Python's Pandas package, we standardized these fields to maximize the amount of usable data in order to provide counts.
3. **Exclusion of unusable entries** — After initial cleaning, some records still contained information that could not be used. These entries included:
 - a. Records with dates or times prior to January 1, 2025, or after December 31, 2025.
 - b. Records with dates or times that were unclear due to formatting issues.
4. **Classification of flight purpose using keyword search** — The Act authorizes 10 permissible uses of drones by law enforcement. Agencies' flight logs included varied text descriptions of flight purpose. To categorize these entries, we used an exploratory keyword-based classification approach.

After data cleaning was complete, we conducted descriptive analyses of data using Microsoft Excel.

Data Limitations

To reduce the reporting burden on law enforcement agencies, we requested that agencies submit existing flight logs rather than manually entering data for each flight. However, these logs displayed several problems, including:

- Significant variation in flight log formats.
- Occasional absence of information required under the Act.
- Narrative descriptions providing reasons for use that required ICJIA interpretation.

Therefore, we used keyword searches to categorize flight purposes, though this approach may not have captured all relevant flights.

To address these and other limitations in the future, we will continue to refine our data collection and analysis processes and explore the potential of automated solutions to improve accuracy and consistency. Our ability to produce comprehensive reports is also contingent on the completeness of agency submissions, available staffing, and technological resources.

For this report, data were requested and reported by calendar year, whereas in prior years, data were requested and reported by state fiscal year. ICJIA implemented this change to ease the reporting burden on law enforcement agencies. In previous years, law enforcement agencies were asked to report drone data through March 31, giving agencies one day to finalize their information before the April 1 statutory deadline for submission of this information to ICJIA. Under the new calendar year timeline, agencies have three months to prepare drone data from the previous calendar year.

Since the new calendar year timeframe does not align with the older timeframe, comparisons between this year's data and data from previous years should be undertaken with caution. Likewise, data presented in this report reflect drone usage only by those law enforcement agencies that submitted data to ICJIA, which amounted to just over 50% of agencies contacted for data. Finally, data suggesting increased drone usage may reflect improved reporting relative to previous years, rather than actual changes in usage.

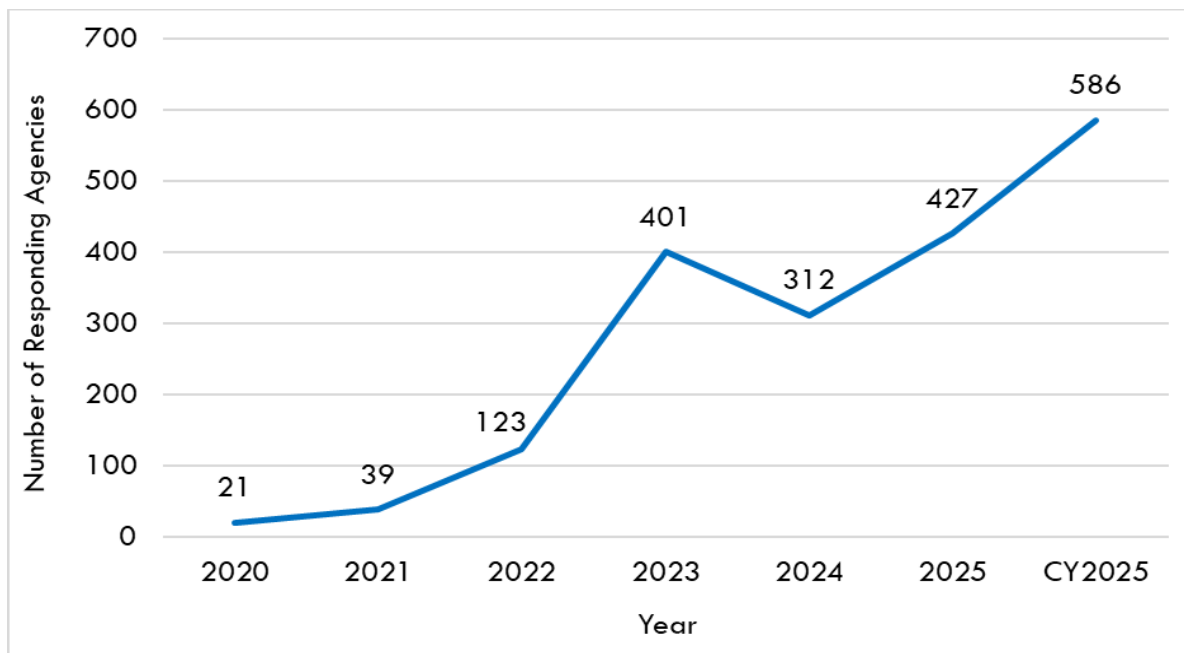
Results

Agencies Reporting Over Time

As shown in Figure 1, the number of responding agencies has grown since SFY2020.

Data Reported

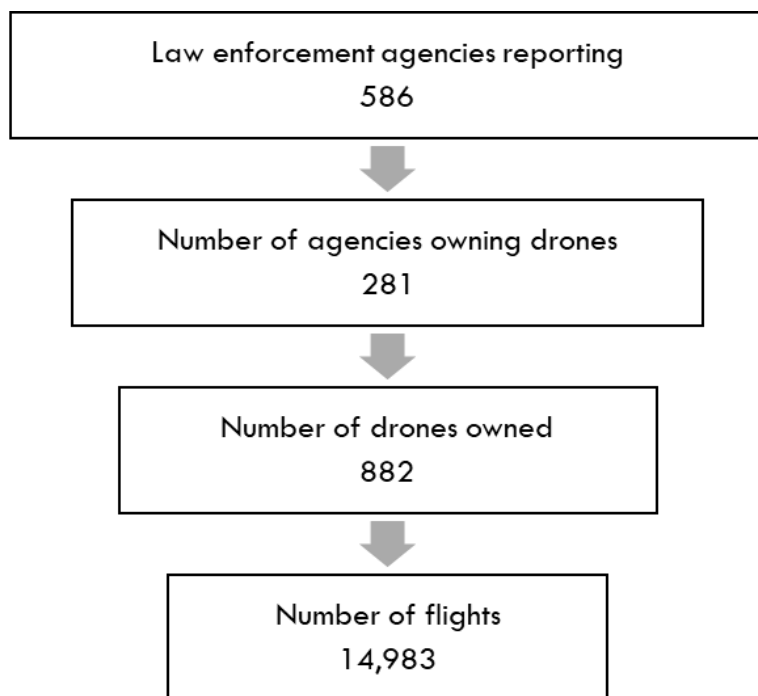

Drone Ownership

Figure 2 provides a general overview of reported drone ownership and flights for CY2025. Of the responding agencies, 48% reported owning drones, and 52% reported no drone ownership. Appendix B provides a table listing all reporting agencies, as well as the number of drones owned and flights reported by each.

Number of Reporting Law Enforcement Agencies, Drones, and Flights, CY2025

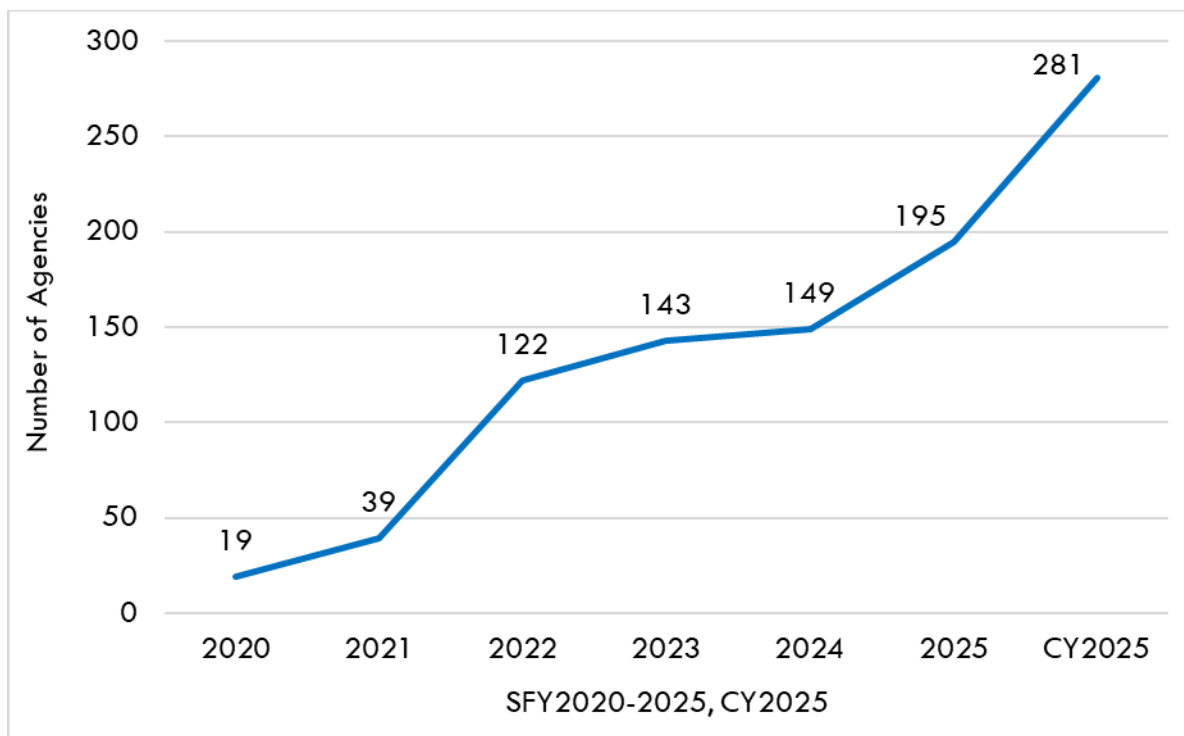

As shown in Figure 3, the number of agencies reporting drone ownership steadily increased from SFY2020 through SFY2025 and into CY2025, and from SFY22 to CY2025, the number of agencies reporting drone ownership more than doubled.

Number of Agencies Reporting Drone Ownership, SFY2020-2025, CY2025



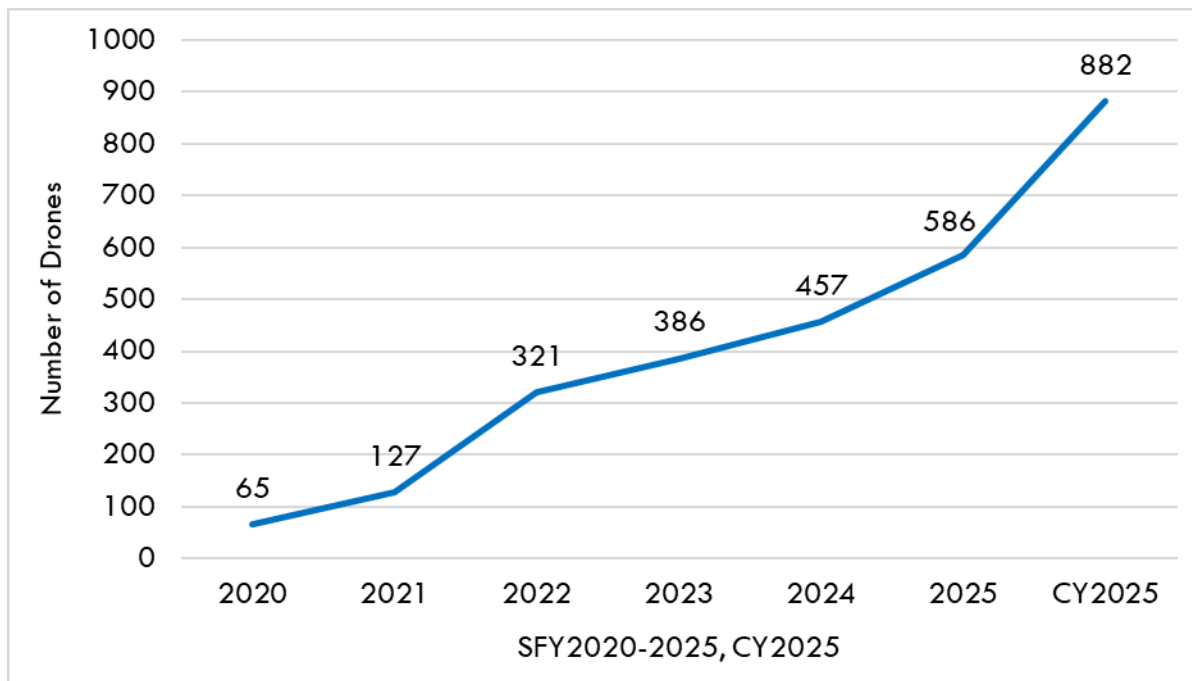

Figure 4 shows the total number of reported drones owned over time. Relative to SFY2020, agencies reported owning nearly 14 times as many drones in CY2025.

In CY2025, agencies reported owning an average of three drones each and a median of two. The Illinois State Police Traffic Crash Reconstruction Unit had the largest fleet, owning 61 drones.

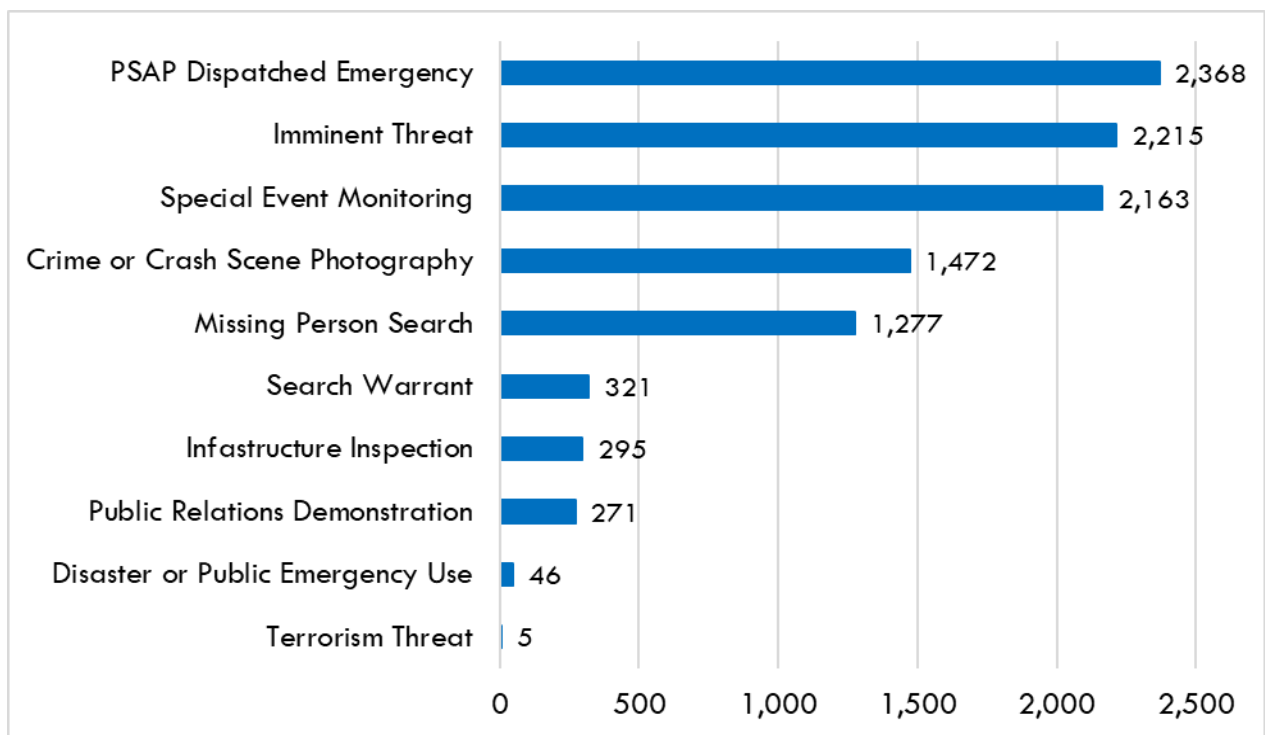
Drone Usage

Agencies reported 14,983 flights and provided details about flight dates, times, locations, and purposes. Of these flights, 4,310 (28.8%) were reported as training flights that taught staff to operate drones or to coordinate with officers and first responders. Figure 5 summarizes the reasons reported for drone flights, categorized according to the 10 permissible uses outlined in Section 15 of the Act. Training flights and 240 flights with missing data are not represented in the figure.

As the figure shows, PSAP (Public Safety Answering Point) Dispatched Emergency response (which involves a 911 dispatch to assist in locating victims or coordinating emergency response) was the most common reason for drone use. The next most common reason involved responding to Imminent Threat, in which “swift action is needed to prevent imminent harm to life, or to prevent the imminent escape of a suspect or the destruction of evidence” [\[725 ILCS 167/15\(3\)\]](#). The third most common use was Special Event Monitoring, in which a drone is used to monitor an event with prior approval and in compliance with FAA regulations.

Reason for Drone Flights, CY2025

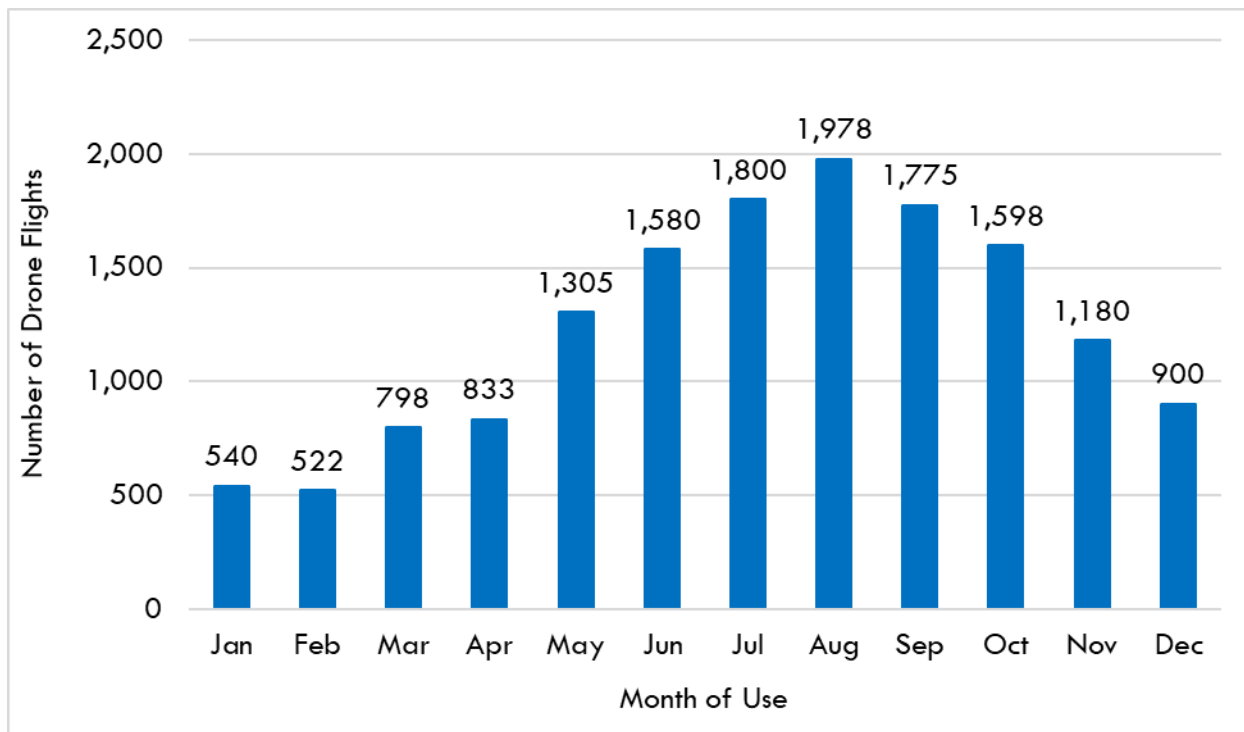

Figure 6 shows the months when drones were reported as being most often used. Drone usage appeared to be highest in the summer and lowest in the winter in CY2025. There were 174 flights with missing month data.

Drone Usage by Month, CY2025



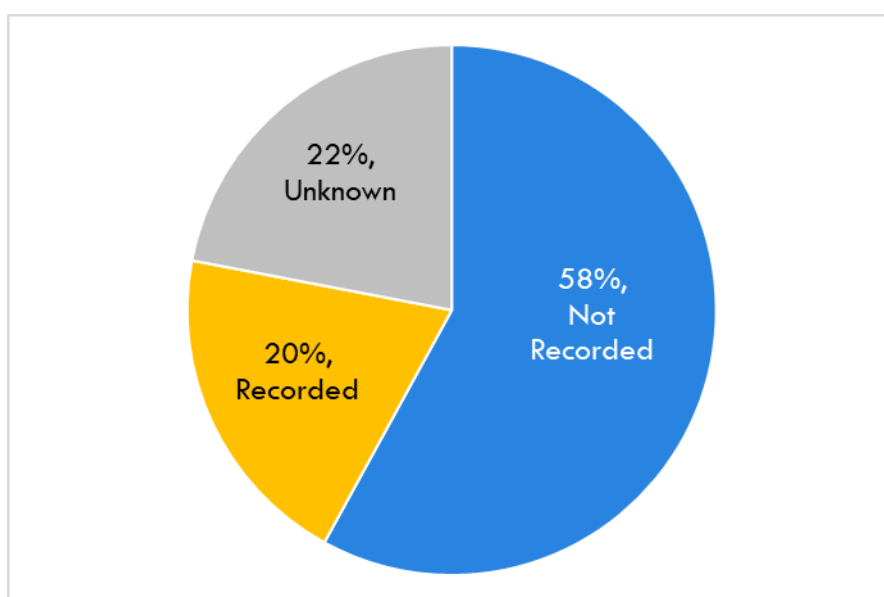

Drone Flight Video Recordings

Law enforcement agencies also reported whether drones were used to record video footage during flights and whether any of this video footage was kept for training purposes. According to reporting agencies, most flights (8,875) were not used to record video footage (Figure 7). In 2,914 flights, video footage was recorded, while in 3,194 flights, it was not known whether video footage was recorded.

Most agencies that used drones to record video footage did so for operational rather than training purposes. Of all flights reported to ICJIA, 1,585 were reported as recording video footage for operational purposes, while 1,055 were reported as recording video footage for training purposes, and 274 were operated for unknown reasons.

Drone Policies

Law enforcement agencies that reported data submitted 327 drone-related policies. Most were labeled as “Unmanned Aircraft Systems” policies, reflecting the Federal Aviation Administration’s terminology for drones. All submitted policies can be downloaded from ICJIA’s [Drone Reporting for Law Enforcement Agencies webpage](#).

Conclusion

This report summarizes Illinois law enforcement drone ownership and usage in CY2025, as required by the Illinois Freedom from Drone Surveillance Act. In CY2025, the number of reporting agencies and the number of drones reported as being owned by these agencies continued to increase relative to previous reporting periods. Reported flights occurred mostly during the summer months. Agencies reported using drones primarily in response to a 911 dispatch to assist in locating victims or coordinating emergency response. Other common reasons for use included responding to imminent threat in order to prevent harm to life, the escape of a suspect, or the destruction of evidence, and monitoring special events with prior approval and in compliance with FAA regulations.

Appendix A: 725 ILCS 167/15

Sec. 15. Exceptions. This Act does not prohibit the use of a drone by a law enforcement agency:

- (1) To counter a high risk of a terrorist attack by a specific individual or organization if the United States Secretary of Homeland Security determines that credible intelligence indicates that there is that risk.
- (2) If a law enforcement agency first obtains a search warrant based on probable cause issued under Section 108-3 of the Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963. The warrant must be limited to a period of 45 days, renewable by the judge upon a showing of good cause for subsequent periods of 45 days.
- (3) If a law enforcement agency possesses reasonable suspicion that, under particular circumstances, swift action is needed to prevent imminent harm to life, or to forestall the imminent escape of a suspect or the destruction of evidence. The use of a drone under this paragraph (3) is limited to a period of 48 hours. Within 24 hours of the initiation of the use of a drone under this paragraph (3), the chief executive officer of the law enforcement agency must report in writing the use of a drone to the local State's Attorney.
- (4) If a law enforcement agency is not undertaking a criminal investigation but is attempting to locate a missing person, engaging in search and rescue operations, or aiding a person who cannot otherwise be safely reached.
- (5) If a law enforcement agency is using a drone solely for crime scene and traffic crash scene photography. Crime scene and traffic crash photography must be conducted in a geographically confined and time-limited manner to document specific occurrences. The use of a drone under this paragraph (5) on private property requires either a search warrant based on probable cause under Section 108-3 of the Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963 or lawful consent to search. The use of a drone under this paragraph (5) on lands, highways, roadways, or areas belonging to this State or political subdivisions of this State does not require a search warrant or consent to search. Any law enforcement agency operating a drone under this paragraph (5) shall make every reasonable attempt to only photograph the crime scene or traffic crash scene and avoid other areas.
- (6) If a law enforcement agency is using a drone during a disaster or public health emergency, as defined by Section 4 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act. The use of a drone under this paragraph (6) does not require an official declaration of a disaster or public health emergency prior to use. A law enforcement agency may use a drone under this paragraph (6) to obtain information necessary for the determination of whether or not a

disaster or public health emergency should be declared, to monitor weather or emergency conditions, to survey damage, or to otherwise coordinate response and recovery efforts. The use of a drone under this paragraph (6) is permissible during the disaster or public health emergency and during subsequent response and recovery efforts.

- (7) To conduct an infrastructure inspection of a designated building or structure at the express request of a local government agency. Any law enforcement agency operating a drone under this paragraph (7) shall make every reasonable attempt to photograph only the building or structure and to avoid other areas.
- (8) To demonstrate the capabilities and functionality of a police drone for public relations purposes, provided that no information is collected or recorded by the drone during such demonstration.
- (9) In response to Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) dispatched calls for service, when the sole purpose for using a drone is for one or more first responders to locate victims, to assist with immediate victim health or safety needs, or to coordinate the response of emergency vehicles and personnel to an emergency. As used in this paragraph (9), "Public Safety Answering Point" and "PSAP" have the meaning given to those terms in Section 2 of the Emergency Telephone System Act.
- (10) If a law enforcement agency is using a drone at a routed event or special event. The use of a drone under this paragraph (10) requires that:
 - (A) notice is posted at the event location for at least 24 hours before the event and clearly communicates that drones may be used at the upcoming event for the purpose of real-time monitoring of participant safety;
 - (B) notice is posted, if practical, at major entry points to the event clearly informing the attendees that a drone may be used for the purpose of real-time monitoring of participant safety; and
 - (C) the drone is flown in accordance with Federal Aviation Administration safety regulations.

Under this paragraph (10), a law enforcement agency may use the drone:

- (i) in advance of an event, before event participants have begun to assemble, for the sole purpose of creating maps and determining appropriate access routes, staging areas, and traffic routes, provided that no personal identifying information is recorded and provided further that no recorded information is used in any criminal prosecution; or

- (ii) during the event to proactively support public safety personnel by monitoring the event footprint in real time:
 - (I) to detect a breach of event space, including a breach by an unauthorized vehicle, an interruption of a parade route, or a breach of an event barricade or fencing;
 - (II) to evaluate crowd size and density;
 - (III) to identify activity that could present a public safety issue for the crowd as a whole, including crowd movement;
 - (IV) to assist in the response of public safety personnel to a real-time public safety incident at the event; and
 - (V) to assess the traffic and pedestrian flow around the event in real time.
